



Gateway Japan Study Tour Program & Guidelines

Eligibility: Enrolment in either Japan Today (ASIA2023) or Governance and Sustainability (GEOG3020)

Application Closing Date 6 March



The Gateway Japan Study Tour is a short-term mid-semester program designed and run by the Department for Asian Studies, University of Adelaide, in collaboration with Tottori University, Japan.

The program provides a unique opportunity for students to explore questions of sustainability and governance in a rural setting in Japan. A special feature of this study tour is that it enables students to think about sustainability outside the existing boundaries of academic fields and disciplines, western cultural frames of reference, and the urban-bias of industrialised civilisation.

It provides an in-depth understanding of the challenges and possibilities all countries face in the post-Fukushima era in relation to energy, ecology and human society. Fieldwork will be conducted at places of rich cultural heritage, as well as in the luxuriant environment of rural Japan as illustrated by Hayao Miyazaki's animation film 'My Neighbour Totoro': farming and fishing villages, a wind farm, a nuclear power plant, Japan's second-largest mega-solar project site, and a Shugendo temple (Mitokusan). It will also include visits to a school and a local government office.

Students can explore a part of Japan which is not dominated by urban sprawl, nor is it a typical tourist destination such as Kyoto and Nara. The program is designed to equip students with knowledge and first-hand experience essential in pursuing study or employment in fields related to Asia. It will also provide a memorable learning experience in the lush Japanese spring – very different to class-based learning in Australia.



HOW TO GET TO TOTTORI FROM OSAKA



To get to Osaka from the airport (about 55 minutes)

From Kansai Airport take JR HARUKA ⇒ Shin-Osaka Station Cost: ¥2,330

To get to Tottori from Osaka (2hrs 40 minutes)

From Shin-Osaka Station take JR SUPER HAKUTO ⇒ Tottori Station

Cost: ¥6,500

Note: If you are using a JR Pass, you will have to pay ¥1,800 surcharge

because a private railway line is used for a section of the trip.



From Namba OCAT take NIHON KOTSU EXPRESS BUS ⇒ Tottori Station

Cost: ¥3,700

Money Matters

Expenses during the Study tour will vary depending on your individual lifestyle, but 5,000 yen (around \$50) should be enough to cover your daily expenses. Again, this is up to you, how much you spend during the Study Tour.

- Please note that meals are NOT included in your accommodation.
- Travellers cheques are very difficult to cash in Japan, especially in Tottori.
- Credit cards can (sometimes) be used. Cash is best.

Withdrawing money in Japan

You can withdraw money, using a foreign credit card, from 1) **JP Bank** ATMs, 2) **7-Eleven Convenience Store** ATMs, both of which are located throughout the country.

- * JP = Japan Post, which means almost every post office has a JP Bank ATM.
- ** If a post office has an ATM, it WILL accept foreign credit cards.

The Post Office is the only place in Tottori where you can use your Aussie credit card to get cash.

The central post office is 5 minutes walk from the Green Morris Hotel. The opening hours of the ATM are:

Weekdays: 7 am to 11 pm Weekends: 9 am to 7 pm Yes! ATMs close at night

- * Smaller post offices close at 6pm
- ** The JP Bank ATM at uni closes at 5pm

"At Kansai Airport, the easiest spot to get cash is from the Citibank ATM in the terminal. It should work well with any Australian card."

<u>Citibank does not have a branch in Tottori.</u>

Mobile phones and WiFi

Free WiFi is rare in Japan.

There are a few options:

If you plan to rent a data SIM card, please read the fine print carefully. For example:

- A fee of 3,000 yen (plus tax) will be charged for lost or damaged SIM cards.
- You cannot use these SIM cards for phone calls or SMS.
- If you stuff up, there is no refund. Make sure you know what size SIM card your phone uses.

WARNING: Make sure you turn off Mobile Data on your phone before you leave Australia or you could be the recipient of an enormous phone bill when you return home.

Survival Japanese

こんにちは	Hello!	Kon'nichiwa

It is less than 5 minutes walk from Tottori railway station to the Green Hotel Morris.

Check-in: Please make sure that you check in between 3 - 5pm on Monday 11th April.

Check-out: Wednesday 20th April.

Leave your luggage at the hotel - don't take it with you to uni.

Special Note about Alcohol: The drinking age in Japan is **20**.

- ⇒ Students under 20: You are breaking the law if you drink alcohol.
- ⇒ Students over 20: Drinking should be restricted to a social level.
